She served as a Director on the AWBA board for 2 terms before we merged with the GFWMUSBC association where she served as a director for 2 terms before the association was disbanded.

She strives on making sure that Forum's reputation is intact and remains that way by working closely with all the tournament directors and making sure the center meets all their needs while they are there.
